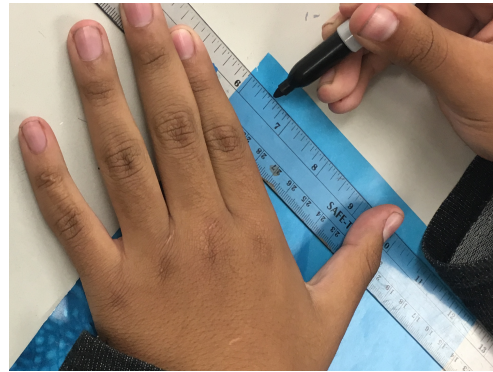
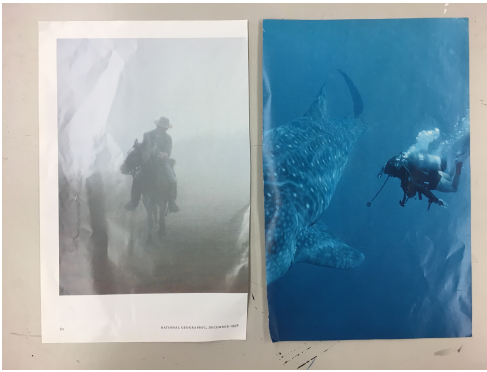


Magazine Paper Weaving Directions



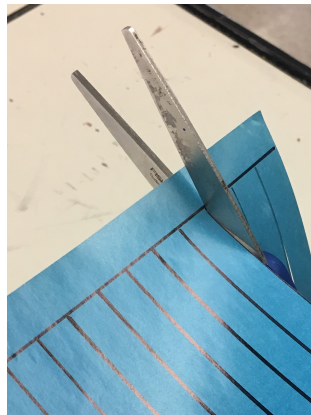
Step 1: Find 2 *contrasting* whole page images from a magazine.

Step 2: Cut them down, if necessary, so that they are the same exact size.

Step 3: On one of the images trace a line near the top of the image, about 1/2 inch down from the top.



Step 4: Trace *vertical* lines across the entire image. The size of the lines may vary. Be careful not to cross into the top margin you created in Step 3. They don't have to be perfect but they should mostly be parallel (meaning, they won't cross over each other).



Step 5: Cut along the lines to create the **warps** of your weaving. (It's like creating fringe.) Do not cut past your margin you made in Step 3.



Step 6: Take the second image and trace horizontal lines across the entire image. These should be going in the opposite direction. These will become the **wefts** of your weaving.

Step 7: Cut ONE weft at a time to stay organized.

Step 8: Weaving one weft through the warps you created in Step 5. Follow the patten of over, under, over, under...

Step 9: Cut another weft and weave it through the warps alternating under, over, under, over. This will create a locking pattern and start to look like a checker board pattern.

Step 10: Repeat steps 7-9 to finish. **Use a very small bit of glue to hold in place.**
